

### **Project Overview**



- Design & Construction of a new police substation that will house both Precinct 19 & CRT-3 (community response team)
- Scope includes project shall include all necessary design, engineering and construction contract administration services to construct a 12,000 to 15,000 SQ FT high performing, energy efficient facility that will house 19 Precinct and CRT-3 as well as a Community Center/ Room based upon Zone concepts as defined in guidelines using PERF\* and IACP\* standards
- Sustainable, high-performance, energy efficient building design.
- Energy goal of 35 EUI (energy usage intensity) with a stretch goal of 25 EUI
- The City is searching for a design team with proven experience in programming and designing police & public safety facilities



### Register to do business with US!

Bidders who wish to respond to RFPs/RFQs must be registered as a vendor with the City of Columbus at time of bid.

Follow these 3 steps to register to do business!





### Registering to do Business with the City of Columbus

#### Step 1 - Vendor Portal Registration

Vendors must register on the Vendor Services portal before doing business with the City of Columbus. To get registered, please visit the following link: columbusvendorservices.powerappsportals.com

When registering, list all capabilities and use the NIGP-Commodities Codes listing to choose commodity codes which apply to your business's abilities to provide services and functions to the City.

#### Step 2 - Contract Compliance Report (EBO Questionnaire)

After vendor registration, you will receive an email instructing you to complete the <u>required</u> Contract Compliance (EBO) Questionnaire. Vendors must be contract compliant to do business with the City of Columbus.

Step 3 – Construction Prequalification and/or Business Enterprise Certification



# What is Construction Prequalification and the Process?

- Pursuant to Section 329.21(g)
   (https://library.municode.com/oh/columbus/codes/code of ordinances), only potential bidders prequalified responsible or prequalified provisionally responsible may be awarded a contract for city construction service work.
- Only licensed construction trade subcontractors prequalified responsible or prequalified provisionally responsible may subcontract or perform on city construction service work.

### Do You Perform Construction Work?

Potential bidders (primes) and the following licensed trade contractors must submit an application for City of Columbus Construction Prequalification:

Heating Ventilating

Air conditioning

Refrigeration

**Electrical** 

**Plumbing** 

**Hydronic** 

**Fire Protection and Firefighting Equipment** 

\* Prequalification is for construction work only

Please allow 30 calendar days from the date of receipt for application processing

# Program and MBE/WBE Special Provisions

The City of Columbus Increase Diversity Program took effect January 1, 2022. It is a comprehensive approach to addressing disparities in the City's contracting procedures and to make an affirmative contribution to the growth and development of small, minority and women-owned business enterprises in Central Ohio. As a part of the program, the City of Columbus established MBE/WBE goal assessments on all purchases of goods and services, professional services and construction projects over \$100K.

- Only MBE/WBE firms certified by the City of Columbus will count toward the goal
- Firms selected to participate and count towards MBE/WBE goals on City of Columbus contract opportunities must be certified with the City of Columbus as an MBE/WBE at time of bid.

✓ To potentially subcontract on a project, request to see the list of firms who have downloaded the plans.

**Establishing Prime and Subcontractor Relationships** 

✓ Businesses who desire to subcontract on a construction project can view the firms that have accessed bid documents to make connections
